| 7. | Remove gloves and perform hand hygiene. Put on new gloves. | | |
| 8. | Assist resident as needed per their transfer status to bed or chair. | | |
| 9. | Remove and cover bedside commode pan and take to the restroom. | | |
| 10. | Prior to disposal, examine feces and/or urine for color, odor, characteristics, and amount. Report any unusual findings to the nurse. | | |
| 11. | Remove gloves and perform hand hygiene. | | |
| 12. | Assist resident to perform hand hygiene. | | |
