



Example Interdisciplinary Team Note:

Resident admitted with Stage IV pressure ulcer to sacrum, healing affected by comorbidities, head of bed chronically elevated due to shortness of breath when lying flat, need for assistance with bed mobility and resident often declines assistance with turning and repositioning. The resident also receives hemodialysis three times a week and is unable to reposition during dialysis.

Resident p.o. intake varies, averages 50 to 75% at meals, staff offer substitutions if less than 50% is consumed. Resident food preferences are honored at mealtimes. Receives double protein at meals and 30 ml of Med Pass three times daily with medication administration to promote wound healing. LAL mattress remains in place and ROHO cushion to wheelchair, ROHO also provided to dialysis center to use during treatment.

Resident continues to receive Vitamin C and Zinc to promote wound healing, No weight loss noted in last 30 days, RD continues to review monthly. Seen by wound MD this week and wound measurements remain unchanged, wound bed and peri wound without signs and symptoms of infection. New orders received as wound has not progressed in the last two weeks. Orders implemented, and resident and responsible party notified. Will continue current interventions.
