
Hand Hygiene Tips For Patients

When to Remind Your Healthcare Worker

- When they enter the treatment area
- Before putting on or after removing gloves
- Before they touch you or your access site
- After they touch you or your access site
- After they touch any part of your care area, including your chair, medical chart, or dialysis machine

How to Remind Your Healthcare Worker

- Keep it positive and polite.
- Say thank you to show your appreciation before or after they complete a hand hygiene action.
- Keep it simple:
 - "Thank you for your hand hygiene action."
 - "Did you clean your hands?"
 - "Did I remind you about hand hygiene?"

Remember, You Are a Part of the Team Too!

- Always wash your hands before and after treatment
- If you have a fistula or graft, you must stop at the sink and wash it before treatment



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
