	Steps *Allow resident to assist as able	Passing	Additional Training Needed			
1.	Explain procedure to resident and offer					
	resident urinal or bedpan before beginning					
	bath. Allow for privacy.					
2.	Fill bath basin with warm water. Ensure					
	resident is comfortable with water					
	temperature.					
3.	Perform hand hygiene and put on gloves.					
4.	Fold washcloth and wet with warm water.					
	Gently wash both eyes from inner to outer					
	corners. Use a different part of the					
	washcloth for each eye.					
5.	Wet washcloth and apply soap - if this is					
	resident preference. Wash, rinse, and pat					
	dry the face, ears, behind ears, and neck.					
6.	Remove resident's gown or clothing. Place					
	towel under the arm. Wash, rinse, and pat					
	dry the hand, arm, underarm, and shoulder.					
	Repeat the steps with the other arm.					
7.	Place a towel over the resident's chest and					
	abdomen area. Lower the bath blanket to					
	the resident's waist.					
8.	Lift towel and wash, rinse, and pat dry the					
	resident's chest and abdominal area. Pull up					
	bath blanket and remove the towel.					
9.	Uncover resident and place the towel under					
	leg. Wash, rinse, and pat dry the resident's leg and foot. Repeat the steps with the					
	other leg and foot.					
10	Change basin water. Removes gloves.					
10.	Perform hand hygiene and put on new					
	gloves.					
11.	Assist resident as needed to spread legs and					
	lift their knees if this is possible.					
12.	Wet and soap a folded washcloth.					
	Catheter Care					
13.	If your resident has a catheter, check for					
	any irritation, leaking, or secretions. Gently					
	wipe 4 inches of catheter from the meatus					
	outward.					

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Steps *Allow resident to assist as able	Passing	Additional Training Needed			
Perineal Care:					
14. Wipe from front to back and from the center of the perineum to the thighs. If the washcloth is visibly soiled, change to a new washcloth.					
Females:					
 Separate the labia and wash the urethral area first. Wash between and outside the labia in downward strokes. Alternate from side to side and moving outward to the thighs. Use different parts of the washcloth for each stroke. 					
Males:					
 Pull back the foreskin if your resident is uncircumcised. Beginning with the urethra, wash and rinse the tip of the penis using circular motions. Continue washing downwards to the scrotum and inner thighs. Rinse off the soap and dry thoroughly. Return the foreskin over the tip of the penis. 					
15. Change basin water. Removes gloves. Perform hand hygiene and put on new gloves.					
 16. Use a clean washcloth to rinse area thoroughly in the same sequence as washing occurred. Gently pat the area dry. 17. Assist your resident to a lateral position, 					
facing away from you.					
 Wet and soap a clean washcloth. Clean the anal area from front to back. Rinse and pat dry thoroughly. 					
 Change basin water. Removes gloves. Perform hand hygiene and put on new gloves. 					
20. Use a clean washcloth and towel to wash, rinse and pat dry from neck to buttocks. Assist your resident to return to the supine position.					
21. Perform hand hygiene and put on new gloves.

22. Assist resident to get clean clothing on.		
23. Sanitize all supplies used per facility policy.		
24. Remove gloves and perform hand hygiene.		
25. Document per facility policy and report any skin issues or any resident changes to the nurse.
