Sepsis Change Package

Sepsis is a life-threatening inflammatory response to severe bacterial infections, with a mortality rate of 40-60%, particularly high among the elderly. The Indiana Hospital Association reported that over 4,400 Hoosiers died from sepsis in 2020, with numbers rising during the COVID-19 pandemic. Nationally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) notes that at least 1.7 million American adults develop sepsis each year, often with underlying medical conditions such as chronic lung disease or weakened immune systems.

The CDC emphasizes the importance of quick recognition and treatment of sepsis, similar to heart attacks and strokes, to improve survival rates. The Sepsis Change Package aims to provide resources to promote best practices by staff, residents, and families. Qsource offers assistance in providing necessary education and reviewing current procedures to enhance sepsis programs.
