Staff Guidance for Patient Kidney Transplant Interest Form

Studies show that kidney transplant improves both the survival rate and quality of life of ESRD patients as compared to dialysis. Transplant centers use a multidisciplinary approach involving the transplant surgeons and physicians, coordinators, social workers, financial counselors, nutritionists, psychologists, referring physicians, and the patients to decide who is a candidate for transplant.

Use the Kidney Transplant Interest Form to identify potential transplant candidates in your clinic. Review with the physician and then refer accordingly. Transplant Programs typically like to hear from the patient themselves early in the process, so you may give the contact information to the patient and follow up to see if they've contacted the Transplant Program, or sit down and call with them at the chairside.
