Appropriate antimicrobials are essential to high-quality patient care

- Timely diagnosis and clear reason for use (indication)
- Clearly defined duration of therapy

Inappropriate antimicrobial use is common and harmful

- Increases antimicrobial resistance at your facility
- Exposes patients to unnecessary medications
- Focus of state survey agencies

Antimicrobial stewardship starts with YOU!

- Everyone should be involved in decreasing inappropriate use
- Focus on unclear/missing diagnosis and on open-ended orders
- Antimicrobial prophylaxis is rarely helpful and should be avoided
- Instead focus on infection prevention activities and

measures



Collaboration is ESSENTIAL!

- Encourage open communication about antimicrobials
- Work with staff, nursing, providers and pharmacists for best outcomes
- Local, state and federal resources are available
